RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe WHEREAS, has reviewed the high cost of travel on official business by Tribal Council members and other executive staff and finds the per diem allowance has not been updated since 1983 to meet the additional inflationary costs; and
- it is in the best interest of the White Mountain WHEREAS, Apache Tribe for its Tribal Council members and certain other executives as previously identified in Resolution No. 83-303 to be paid additional per diem in accordance with inflationary costs;
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe modifies Resolution No. 83-303 to increase in-state per diem allowances from \$50.00 per day for room and board to \$75.00 per day, and from \$100.00 per day for high cost areas out of state as identified by Tribal Travel Regulations to \$175.00 per day.
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that all other Tribal Travel Regulations and resolutions related thereto remain in full force and effect.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
