RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested from the Congress of the United States, special appropriations in the amount of \$4 million to relieve the financial loss to the White Mountain Apache Tribe occasioned by the necessity of reducing the annual allowable cut from the forest from 82 MMBF to 67.6 MMBF in Fiscal Year 1988-89; and
- a justification to support the \$4 million request is WHEREAS, needed and one has been prepared by the White Mountain Apache Tribe's consultants and presented to the Tribal Council on June 15, 1988, by the FATCO General Manager.
- BE IT RESOLVED Tribal Council of the White Mountain that the Apache Tribe hereby approves the action to request \$4 million from the U.S. Congress and accepts the justification as presented by the consultants and the FATCO General Manager; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that consultants are directed to present the White Mountain Apache Tribe request not only to Senator Dennis DeConcini from Arizona but also to all members of the Senate and House of Representatives Appropriations Committees.

The foregoing resolution was on June 15, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
