

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, On August 7, 1986 the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe approved Resolution 86-254 permitting tribal members to seek out and capture wild horses; and

WHEREAS, the General Livestock Board members have suggested and the Tribal Council has agreed that the problem of wild horses can and should be addressed through the local Livestock Associations.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it rescinds in its entirety Resolution 86-254; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the local Livestock Associations are hereby authorized to deal with the wild horse problem in their own areas and tribal members are directed to work through the local Livestock Associations for permission to seek out and capture wild horses for personal use; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall go into effect thirty (30) days from this date and the Tribal Council Secretary shall forthwith post notices of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on June 15, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
