

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council having been advised by the Commissioner of Justice concerning the requirements of the Tribal Judicial Code concerning Tribal Judge selections; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council having complied with said Judicial Code requirement and having received public nominations, and having elected to select the Tribal Judiciary by secret ballot, the Tribal Council does hereby unanimously appoint the Honorable Judge Kay Lewis to a third (4) year term as Juvenile Court Judge of the Juvenile Court, said term to be effective on June 16, 1988; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, in compliance with the Judicial Code, and in the interest of the public good, shall require Juvenile Judge Kay Lewis to be subject to a RETENTION VOTE during the next White Mountain Apache General Election, wherein he will be placed on the 1990 General Election Ballot for a "RETAIN" or "DO NOT RETAIN" vote by the registered voters of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints Kay Lewis to the position of Juvenile Judge of the Tribal Juvenile Court, with all responsibilities of that office as described within the Tribal Judicial Code and any other additional duties which the governing body may see fit to impose.


The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
