RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Councilman Ray Ivans has brought to the attention of the Tribal Council the serious problem of free roaming horses within the communities and housing areas of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and in the road way rights of way; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe considers these free roaming horses a safety as well as health hazard to the citizens of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe intends to address the horse problem by amending Ordinance No. 99 to strengthen the enforcement provisions.
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe directs the Secretary of the Tribal Council to post notices such that the general public will be aware that horses trespassing in residential areas and in the road rights of way will be picked up and appropriately dealt with under the Code.

The foregoing resolution was on June 22, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
