RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that the B.I.A. Forestry Dispatcher position has been vacant for more than two years since the retirement of Broadus Bones; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe considers this position a very important one particularly in light of the vital importance of the forests to the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the forests are endangered by fires particularly at this time of the year; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe believes there are qualified tribal members who can fill this position.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it urges the B.I.A. Forestry Department and the BIA to take appropriate steps to immediately fill the position of fire dispatcher.

The foregoing resolution was on June 22, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
