RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Joanna Bennett, tribal member, is living in a house belonging to the White Mountain Apache Tribe and that said house is in sore need of repair; and in all probability is in such a condition that said house needs to be condemned; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to take some action regarding this matter as decent housing for tribal members is a concern and in addition, the possible liability to the Tribe is a grave concern.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe directs that the Safety Department in cooperation and coordination with IHS Environmental Health, inspect and condemn said house if appropriate; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that upon such condemnation, should Ms.

 Joanna Bennett choose to continue to inhabit said house, that such decision is her own choice and she is hereby advised that the White Mountain Apache Tribe will accept no liability in this regard.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of \underline{SIX} for and \underline{ZERO} against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
