RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authority has received information from H.U.D. that \$3.8 million will be allocated for FY 89 for approximately 57 units of housing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is very concerned about the rising cost of each individual house which increased cost reduces the number of units available; and
- WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its members that all efforts be made to reduce the costs of individual units so that more units can be built.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Housing Authority Board to undertake all appropriate costs savings measures in the planning for the housing projects utilizing the \$3.8 million, including utilization of already and previously developed architectual plans and drawings; and utilization of FATCO products where feasible.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Housing Authority Board is directed to adopt plans which are more tailored to White Mountain Apache Tribal needs, that such plans should include building on scattered housing sites.

The foregoing resolution was on July 12, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
