RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 06-87-197 the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe set priorities for road construction which included "Route #48 Improve road from Amos Ranch to Forestdale", and
- WHEREAS, the BIA Area Roads Department has informed the Tribal Council that money for such project has been programmed for fiscal year 1990; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the best interests of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for term economic development purposes desires to have the Route #48 Project accelerated.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby direct Vernon Palmer of the BIA Area Office Roads Department to accelerate the process for road construction on Route #48 by moving the project from Fiscal 1990 to Fiscal 1980, thus changing the priority of Route #48 construction from #9 in Resolution No. 06-87-197 to a priority equivalent to #1.

The foregoing resolution was on August 3, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ONE</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
