

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 04-88-92 requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs prepare for sale 4 mmbf of dead spruce timber; and
- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 04-88-93 requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs prepare for sale 2 mmbf of aspen timber; and
- WHEREAS, in order to expedite this process it would be appropriate to sell a portion of this volume under a paid permit; and
- WHEREAS, Bureau of Indian Affairs regulations allow for the sale of forest products under paid permit, not to exceed a stumpage value of \$10,000; and
- WHEREAS, the Timber Use Rules and Instructions currently in effect do not address this type of permit; and
- WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee has reviewed this proposal and recommended approval; and
- WHEREAS, consent of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is required prior to issuing any permits.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that approval is hereby granted to execute the sale of up to 2 mmbf of aspen and up to 4 mmbf of dead spruce under a series of advertised paid permits and/or timber sales.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other stipulations of Resolutions 04-88-92 and 04-88-93 remain in effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fort Apache Forest Manager is designated to act for the Tribal Chairman as issuing Officer for these permits, and who will also be the Superintendent's delegated representative as Approving Officer.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and

approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958,
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
984).

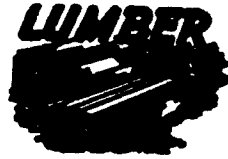


