RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Food Distribution Program has come before the Tribal Council requesting Council authorization to apply for FY 88/89 funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture; and
- WHEREAS, the application is necessary in order to receive food commodities for the communities of Whiteriver, East Fork, Seven Mile, Canyon Day, Cedar Creek, Carrizo, McNary and Cibecue, and in addition, for all tribal members residing in Show Low and Pinetop/Lakeside, and
- WHEREAS, the objective of the program is to help improve the diets of the elderly and needy who are in need of food assistance; and
- WHEREAS, it has been determined that a significant number of tribal members exist who are in need of food and are eligible under the program guidelines.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Food Distribution Director, to apply for FY 88/89 U.S.D.A. funding for the Food Distribution Program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman, and in his absence, the Vice Chairman to execute any and all documents necessary to apply for and receive funds for the Food Distribution Program.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
