## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Land Board has considered homesites and farmland assignments and through the Director of the Land Office, Raymus Albert, has presented these recommendations in reports and meeting minutes dated July 8, 14, 21 and 28, 1988 to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, part of this report is a request for the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to approve moving the location of Carson Foster's previously approved site to another site because of interference with power lines at the previously approved location; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council approval of the actions of the Land Board is in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Land Board actions as presented to the Tribal Council by the Director of the Land Office are approved and ratified; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Land Board decision to move the homesite of Carson Foster is hereby approved.

The foregoing resolution was on August 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
