RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that additional highway signs to control traffic for the health and safety of the residents of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are needed particularly at the Cibecue Junction and the turnoffs at Cradle Board Town and Chinatown, and that cattleguards are needed at the Sunrise Boundary and the turn off at Bones residence at Fort Apache; and

WHEREAS, Councilman Herbert Tate has brought this matter to the Tribal Council for discussion and action.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby directs Councilman Tate to bring these matters to the attention of the Arizona Department of Transportation and further to conduct a survey regarding this matter and coordinate with all appropriate parties to accomplish the intent of the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on August 17, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
