

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the disease of alcoholism is prevalent on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and its affects are such that most White Mountain Apache families are affected in some manner by the disease; and
- WHEREAS, education and training related to the disease of alcoholism is essential to begin to address the problems associated with the disease; and
- WHEREAS, the Natives of Alkali Lake, B.C. Canada, have developed an alcoholism program called New Directions which program has resulted in nearly 95% sobriety in the Shuswop Indian Band; and
- WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to support participation in programs for Apache youth such as New Directions; and
- WHEREAS, the Apache Tribal Guidance Center has made arrangements for eight White Mountain Apache Tribal youths to participate in New Directions training in Sells, Arizona.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appropriates \$2,000.00 from the Land Claims Fund for eight White Mountain Apache Tribal youths to participate in the New Directions Training related to alcoholism to be held in Sells, Arizona on August 15-19, 1988.

The foregoing resolution was on August 18, 1988 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as shown by the attached Exhibit B showing their signatures; this action is taken pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


