RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the Governing Body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has the right to waive the Tribal Mandate placing a freeze on salary for tribal employees; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe negotiated a Contract which begins October 1, 1988 with Indian Health Service for the 638 Programs; and
- WHEREAS, this Contract has provided for much needed salary increases for Tribal Health Authority Programs from funds already identified in the Contract Proposal; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service supports these salary increases; and
- WHEREAS, these employees have not been eligible for increases given to tribally paid employees in the past; and
- WHEREAS, these employees deserve to be paid at a level that is reasonable and fair for the services they provide in the community.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to waive the policy mandating salary freezes for tribal employees and granting the Tribal Health Authority Director the authority to implement the contract as proposed.


The foregoing resolution was on September 14, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of FIVE for and TWO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
