## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Tribal Council by the Utility Authority manager that it has been noted by utility workers that there is a continual flow of sewage water through the system into various treatment facilities, and this flow is constant, 24 hours a day; and
- WHEREAS, this constant sewage flow is caused primarily by leaky faucets in sinks and tubs and by faulty toilet fixtures located in residences, offices and business establishments; and
- WHEREAS, the continual "extra" flow of clean and unused water into the sewage system results in extra pumping time on the well pumps which contributes to high electrical pumping cost and excessive wear and tear on the pump and motor; and
- WHEREAS, cost savings to the Tribe would be realized by the immediate repair of the leaks throughout all residences, offices and business establishments served by the community water systems.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorizes the Utility manager and the Planning office to seek funds for a leak repair program utilizing the summer employment training program. The program will include a visit to each residence, office and business for the purpose of undertaking corrective measures related to water leaks.

The foregoing resolution was on September 15, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
