

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Domestic Violence Awareness Week will be observed throughout the Fort Apache Indian Reservation during the week of December 11-17, 1988; and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of this observance is to educate communities, increase awareness of family violence and the programs that serve them; and
- WHEREAS, Domestic Violence-the physical abuse of children and spouse-is one of this Reservations major problems and concerns; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to recognize and support the efforts of the Committee for Family Peace in understanding and treating Domestic Violence; and
- WHEREAS, Educating tribal members about Domestic Violence and its effects will contribute to family togetherness, peace and harmony;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby proclaims the week of December 11-17, 1988 as ("Dzaaye La Gozhoo"), "This Place Here is Peace and Harmony";

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby encourages tribal members and other concerned community members to support and participate in the scheduled events in the hopes of reducing and eventually eliminating incidents of Domestic Violence, especially those offenses committed against children and women.

The foregoing resolution was on November 9, 1988 duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
