

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports the efforts of Northland Pioneer College to connect its Whiteriver campus to the college's microwave network that links together its eight other campuses; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports students in Whiteriver being able to participate in the eighteen additional classes that Northland Pioneer College will be offering on the network each semester; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the positive impact of students at the Whiteriver campus being able to see and speak with students at the other eight campuses via the live two-way video microwave network; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to cooperate in the construction of this network by providing 200 sq.ft. of land for the construction of a microwave tower site on McKay's Peak and 25 sq.ft. for a passive reflector site on the ridge overlooking the Whiteriver campus; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the construction of the two sites will have no adverse impact on the environment or landscape; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is willing to enter into a written agreement with Northland Pioneer College regarding the requested microwave tower sites with conditions to be mutually acceptable to both the Tribal Council and Northland Pioneer College.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it fully supports the connection of Northland Pioneer College's Whiteriver campus to the microwave network and agrees to provide the land necessary for tower construction with conditions to be mutually acceptable to both the Tribal Council and Northland Pioneer College.

The foregoing resolution was on November 9, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of

-the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
