RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service entered into agreements with the White Mountain Apache Tribe to construct water supply and sewage disposal facilities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, no such project is constructed without prior approval by the Tribal Council in the form of a Resolution enabling the Chairman to sign a Memorandum of Agreement for the project; and
- WHEREAS, upon completion of these projects they are formally transferred to the White Mountain Apache Tribe to be operated and maintained by the Tribal Utility Authority by the execution of a Transfer Agreement;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESCLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to sign all such Transfer Agreements on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe after: 1) the Tribal Utility Authority Board of Directors approves and signs the Agreement; and 2) the Ad-Hoc Committee, made up of Council Members appointed by the Tribal Chairman and approved by the Tribal Council, approve the Agreements. The Ad-Hoc Committee may refer such Transfer Agreements for consideration by the entire Tribal Council when such projects are considered unusual, complex, or if any significant objections are known to exist against entering into the Transfer Agreement.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

WHEREAS, the United States of America, acting through the Indian Health Service, Department of Health and Human Services, under and pursuant to the provisions of Public law 86-121 (73 Stat. 267), hereinafter called the IHS; and the White Mountain Apache Tribe, hereinafter called the Tribe, acting through the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council; and the White Mountain Apache Utility Authority, hereinafter called the Utility Authority, entered into a Memorandum of Agreement executed for the IHS on February 17, 1984, for the Tribe on February 7, 1984, and for the Utility Authority on February 7, 1984, regarding the provision of sanitation facilities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the project provided for in that agreement has been completed; and WHEREAS, the domestic water supply and the appurtenances thereto and the materials, supplies and equipment provided for and incorporated therein pursuant to that agreement are the property of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of providing for and assuring the proper and efficient maintenance and continued operation of said water supply and waste disposal facilities; and WHEREAS, under Section 7 (a)(4) of Public law 86-121, the IHS on behalf of the United States of America is authorized to transfer the completed facilities with or without a money consideration, and under such terms and conditions as are appropriate, having regard to the contributions made and the maintenance responsibility undertaken, and the special health needs of the Indian people.

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the terms of said agreement, and pursuant to Section 7 (a)(4) of Public Law 86-121:

- The IHS hereby transfers, assigns, and conveys to the Utility Authority through the Tribe, without a money consideration and under the terms and conditions set forth in the aforesaid agreement, all of the right, title and interest of the United States of America in all community facilities and appurtenances thereto constructed, including all materials, supplies, and equipment provided for and incorporated in such facilities. Refer to Attachment A for a list of the items transferred and the appropriate receiving agency.
- 2. The IHS will assist the Utility Authority in startup operations of the system and will correct any defect related to material or workmanship jointly identified by the Tribe, Utility Authority, and the IHS for a period of one year from the date of beneficial operation which was June 1, 1986.
- 3. The Utility Authority, through the Tribe, hereby accepts such transfer under the terms and conditions set forth in the aforesaid Memorandum of Agreement and agrees to operate, maintain and repair such facilities as the property of the Utility Authority to keep the facilities in an effective and operating condition.
