RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, District II Councilman, Kino Kane, is requesting Tribal Council support for the renovation of the Cedar Creek Trading Post for use as a grocery/goods store; and
- WHEREAS, the Cedar Creek Community and the additional communities of Canyon Day and Seven Mile are in need of facilities making groceries and other goods available to the communities without the necessity of traveling great distances to obtain said groceries and goods; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council proposes that the Apache Enterprise look into the feasibility of maintaining and operating the Cedar Creek Trading Post and other facilities in the other two communities as grocery and goods stores, along with its other retail outlets; and further that funding for this project come from the Apache Enterprise budget; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the need for these types of facilities in the Cedar Creek, Canyon Day and Seven Mile communities, and concurs with this request.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Apache Enterprise and the Skill Center to conduct feasibility studies for the renovation of the Cedar Creek Trading Post for operation as a grocery/goods store, and additionally to study the feasibility of such stores at Canyon Day and Seven Mile.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
