## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the 4th International Winter Special Olympics Games will be held April 1-8, 1989 in the Reno/Tahoe Squaw Valley area; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is informed by David Hansen, the Special Education Coordinator for the Whiteriver Elementary School that a tribal member, Nolan Potter, has been selected from among 42 special olympic athletes to compete in the downhill skiing event at the games; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes it to be in the best interests of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its members to wholeheartedly support Nolan Potter and the Special Olympics.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby commends and congratulate Nolan Potter on his selection and wishes him the very best in the athletic competition at the 4th International Winter Special Olympics; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that as evidence of their support, \$750.00 is here by appropriated for Nolan Potter's use to cover airline fare, food and lodging at the games; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that if for any reason Nolan Potter cannot attend, the money shall be used for the expenses of Nathaniel Quesada to attend said games as an alternate; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Controller is hereby directed to carry out the actions needed to implement this resolution.
