RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by Mrs. Betty (Nagle) Harvey she has been selected to be a Mutual Help Housing participant in Project AZ 16-43; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Nagle needs a homesite to become a recipient of a Mutual-Help house; and
- WHEREAS, Council Member Phillip Stago, Jr. has suggested on behalf of Mrs. Harvey that a lot available within the Fort Apache Agency Bureau of Indian Affairs compound should be made available for Mrs. Harvey; and
- WHEREAS, there are currently no conflicting plans that would prevent Mrs. Betty (Nagle) Harvey from acquiring the tribal land assigned to the Fort Apache Agency; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Betty (Nagle) Harvey shall, as a courtesy, report to the Tribal Land Board the Homesite Assignment;
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mrs. Betty (Nagle) Harvey is granted a homesite located within the Fort Apache Agency Bureau of Indian Affairs compound.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Land Board develop the legal description of the site and provide it to the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority.

The foregoing resolution was on February 8, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of FIVE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
