

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the problem of feral or stray horses, feral dogs and coyotes is of concern to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has suggested in its letter of February 28, 1989, several ways to address the problem.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Tribal Chairman to meet with the BIA Superintendent and his staff and set up a public meeting to invoke the public in possible implementation of programs to address said problems.

The foregoing resolution was on March 2, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of Five for and Zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
