

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by Resolution No. 11-88-265 enacted November 10, 1988, directed that the fencing activities being carried out by Shirley and Jack Fowler cease; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised by the Land Office and the parties that the dispute has been settled.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the cease and desist order of November 10, 1988 directed at the fencing activities of Shirley and Jack Fowler is lifted and the Fowlers' may implement their fencing plans.

The foregoing resolution was on April 16, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
