## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is recognized by the United States of America as the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council gave its consent to Farmers Home Administration to build approximately 30 houses on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, some of which houses are now being sold through the foreclosure process; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council desires to utilize the services of the Bureau of Indian Affairs for appraisals of fair market value for the sale of these houses so that the White Mountain Apache Tribe can evaluate and make a determination regarding purchase of said houses.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is requested to initiate and carry out the process for appraisal of fair market value of the approximately 30 Farmers Home Administration houses, for the sole benefit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 25, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
