

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, tribal member Eddie Gloshey has appeared before the Tribal Council during the period set aside for tribal member business with a request for monetary assistance; and

WHEREAS, the monetary assistance request will be used for Mr. Gloshey to attend engraving school in the State of Nebraska so that he can enhance his jewelry business; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes it is in the best interest of its membership to assist members like Mr. Gloshey who have shown initiative and motivation to help themselves in difficult circumstances and has through his own efforts established his own business.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby appropriates \$200.00 as monetary assistance to Mr. Eddie Gloshey.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that financial services and the Chairman's Office are directed to take all appropriate actions to implement this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on July 12, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
