

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Roy Colelay has brought to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe the problems he has encountered on the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority Project AZ 16-43/44 due to recent archaeological surveys; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe believes that the Board of Directors of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority has authority to address the problems of individual Apache members who have been selected as participants in HUD housing projects.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Chairman Reno Johnson, Sr., to bring these matters to the attention of Victor Velasquez and the Board of Directors of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority and to relate to the Board of Directors the expectation of the Tribal Council that they will address in a meaningful way the issues of concern to the members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and their families.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


