

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Councilman Ray Ivans as the Safety Director for the White Mountain Apache Tribe has brought to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe the need for an ordinance controlling fireworks, their purchase, use and displays on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, unauthorized use of fireworks poses a danger to the White Mountain Apache Tribe because of the known fire hazard caused by such fireworks use; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe believes it to be in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to protect its' tribal members and land from unauthorized and dangerous use of fireworks on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Legal Department of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is hereby directed to develop an ordinance to regulate the purchase and use and display of fireworks on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; such ordinance should include authority for the Chief of Police to monitor and permit such use;

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that while the Ordinance is being developed, the Chief of Police is delegated the responsibility of monitoring use of fireworks on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


