FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the residents of Cedar Creek, Carrizo area are requesting tribal assistance to arrange for power to service the television site on the peak in those communities; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council cannot consider such a assistance until an estimate for the cost is available.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby request that Navapache Co-op provide an estimate of the cost of bringing power to the television site to the Cedar Creek and Carrizo communities.

The foregoing resolution was on September 19, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).




WHEREAS, the Tribal Council cannot consider such a assistance until an estimate for the cost is available.


