WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona does not officially recognize a holiday honoring Martin Luther King, Jr.,; and

WHEREAS, such recognition is entirely appropriate based on Martin Luther King Jr.'s undisputed contributions to equal rights for all people in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe fully recognizes and appreciates Martin Luther King Jr.'s tremendous contributions to this country and believes special recognition is due his great service.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it fully supports the enactment in the State of Arizona of a special holiday recognizing and acknowledging Martin Luther King, Jr. and his tremendous contributions to civil rights in this country.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Council urges the Arizona legislators to pass the necessary legislation making such a holiday official in Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on September September 20, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
