

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on October 3, 1989, the White Mountain Apache Tribe received an executed copy of the Indirect Cost Negotiation Agreement for use on Contracts and Grants between the Federal Government and the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, according to the agreement an Indirect Cost Rate of 24.3% will be in effect on all 638 tribal contracts from May 1, 1989 through April 30, 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service does not presently have a separate pool for Indirect Cost and said amounts are included in Program Service Funds from which the Indirect Cost amounts must be paid; and

WHEREAS, the Health Programs for the White Mountain Apache Tribe are delivering critical services at very minimal funding levels and in some cases, the limited funding is insufficient to meet the needs of the Apache people.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that is hereby authorizes a waiver of the difference between the present rate of 18%.0 and the 24.3% Indirect Cost Rate from May 1, 1989 through September 30, 1989 for the following Health Programs being provided by the Tribe pursuant to contract with the Indian Health Service: Emergency Medical Services, Mental Health Services, Alcohol Treatment Program, Community Health Representative Services, Patient Transportation Program, Health Authority and Health Education Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby directs Health Authority Director to work with the Tribal Chairman and his office to convey to the IHS and appropriate congressional delegates the need for adequate Indirect Cost Funding in IHS budgets.

The foregoing resolution was on October 11, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b and k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
