## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Travis Colelay, a tribal member and resident of the North Fork District, has advised the Tribal Council that her home in North Fork is without running water and this fact has led to a health hazard being created at her home; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Colelay has several small children who would benefit immensely from the installation of running water in her home; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware that there is a water supply line installed in the nearby vicinity of Mrs. Colelay's home and that the Indian Health Service has funds available for the installation of water service lines to tribal member homes;
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recognizes the needs of Mrs. Colelay to have running water installed into her home, and further recognizes the immediate necessity of doing so in view of the health care problems being experienced by Mrs. Colelay's children;
- BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tribal Council urgently requests the Indian Health Service to give Mrs. Colelay's request for installation of water service lines the highest possible priority and to proceed forthwith to arrange for construction of a water service line to Mrs. Colelay's residence.

The foregoing resolution was on December 7, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
