

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, during the past year and in previous years, the White Mountain Apache Nation has received a planning grant from the Economic Development Administration; and

WHEREAS, this planning grant has been the cornerstone of the budget on which the Planning Department's Tribal Planner has operated; and

WHEREAS, by having this planning grant the White Mountain Apache Reservation has developed and maintained an excellent working relationship with the Economic Development Administration on the State, Regional and National levels; and

WHEREAS, this excellent working relationship along with the obvious benefits that this has brought, has enhanced the economic development of the the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, this relationship with EDA has resulted in numerous grants through the years, and most recently, the two projects now under construction at the Sunrise Ski Resort which will mean millions of dollars in additional revenues for Sunrise and the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe appreciates the opportunity to work with EDA on projects that lead to greater self-sufficiency for the White Mountain Apache people.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorizes the Planning Department's Tribal Planner to reapply for a planning grant through the Seattle Regional Offices of the Economic Development Administration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe expresses its appreciation to EDA and its staff for the meaningful assistance it has rendered over the years to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on December 14, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of

the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
