

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the western boundary of the Deer Springs Timber Sale was drawn on road B50; and

WHEREAS, approximately 250 acres of timber needing logging now lie immediately adjacent to the west edge of road B50; and

WHEREAS, these 250 acres of timber would otherwise be sold and removed at a later time as part of the Whiskey Trail Timber Sale; and


WHEREAS, it is economically desirable to remove this timber at one time as part of the Deer Springs Timber Sale.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe approves incorporating the 250 acres shown on the attached map into the Deer Springs Timber Sale and modifying the sale boundary accordingly.

The foregoing resolution was on January 31, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
