

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, tribal member Vanta (Quintero) Hinton has come before the Tribal Council to request financial assistance so that her daughter, Shea Hinton, might be able to accept an invitation to take a trip the first of March for a week and one half to Washington D.C.; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe believes such educational experiences are in the best interest of the young people of the Tribe;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes \$1,000.00 to be used for Shea Hinton to take a trip to Washington D.C. with the American Heritage East Program of Alameda Junior High School of Pocatello, Idaho the first of March, said funds to be made available from the General Land Claim Funds.

The foregoing resolution was on February 14, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984)
