WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Save the Children Federation (SCF), an international, non-profit, non-sectarian, non-governmental organization, is dedicated to assisting children, their families, and their communities in this country and abroad to help themselves to a better life through the community development process; and

WHEREAS, Save the Children believes in helping people to help themselves through the community development process to help reach their goals and improve their living conditions in their own way, with dignity and pride; and

WHEREAS, Save the Children relies on local support to identify problems and needs, plan solutions, implement activities, and evaluate success through Community Volunteer Committees; and

WHEREAS, Save the Children raises funds for community based development projects through sponsorship, private and corporate contributions, and selected government grants;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby reaffirms its support of the philosophy of the Save the Children Federation;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council reaffirms its support and approval of the establishment and continued operation of Save the Children Federation (SCF) within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.


