## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Public Health Service has come before the Tribal Council with a proposal for a water treatment plan for the town of Whiteriver, which would eliminate low capacity wells and would involve construction of a river intake structure and water filtration plant; and
- WHEREAS, the Public Health Service advises the Tribal Council that funds are available to construct the Whiteriver Treatment Plant and Filtration System, and has agreed to provide full training to the designated water operator during the construction of the filtration plant, and that approval of the Tribal Council is requested by Public Health Service to commence construction in the near future; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is appreciative of the efforts made by the Public Health Service to consolidate and improve the water system in Whiteriver, and further concludes that such a system will be of great benefit to the White Mountain Apache Tribe and in particular, the people who reside in the Whiteriver area.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants approval for the Public Health Service to proceed with the Whiteriver Water Treatment and Filtration Plan improvements, known as Project No. 480.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Public Health Service will provide full training to the designated water operation during construction of the filtration plant.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to operating and maintaining the proposed water treatment and filtration plant including hiring a certified water operator.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 6, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the <u>Tribal Council</u> of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
