## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Council Member Virgil Hinton has advised the Tribal Council that the home of Audie and Nancy Skidmore in the Rainbow City area has burned to the ground; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that said home was paid for but the Skidmores did not have any fire insurance to rebuild the home and that they are presently homeless and will be temporarily housed in a rental unit owned by the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority.
- WHEREAS, Mr. Hinton requests on behalf of the Skidmores that they be placed on the priority list for HIP housing, said housing to be located on their ancestral land; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that good cause exists for placement of the Skidmores on the priority list for HIP housing.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that Audie and Nancy Skidmore be placed immediately on the priority list for HIP housing.

The foregoing resolution was on February 13, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
