RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been informed by the School Supervisor and the School Board of the John F. Kennedy School that they would like to initiate a proposal for applying for new school construction; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been asked to support this proposal and to approve a land site for said construction; and
- WHEREAS, this proposal will provide better permanent classrooms for all students who are presently housed in mobile units.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the foregoing proposal to provide White Mountain Apache student attending the John F. Kennedy School with adequate classrooms for the benefit of their education.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the School Administrator of the John F. Kennedy School, Mrs. Patricia Banashley, to petition the Tribal Land Board for a land site for the proposed classroom construction.

The foregoing resolution was on February 13, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
