RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed a priority list for BIA road construction within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the following comprises the order of preference and priority for road construction on the reservation:

District I:

- 1. Oak Creek Livestock Road (seven miles)
- 2. Cibecue Mountain (safety reasons)
- 3. All community roads, including cemetery roads.

District II:

- 1. Cost Sharing State Highway 73
- 2. R-14 Crossing
- 3. All community roads, including cemetery roads.

District III:

- 1. Stago Curve
- 2. East Fork Trading Post Loop
- 3. All community roads, including cemetery roads.

<u>District IV:</u>

1. All community roads, including cemetery roads; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing, the Tribal Council hereby designates the following priorities:

West Whiskey Flats
7-Mile Jr.
7-Mile (Willie Nozie)
West Diamond Creek (Stomp Dr)
Ft. Apache (Little Cedar Creek)
Ft. Apache - Canyon Day Subdivision
7-Mile (Sha-na-na Drive)
West Cibecue Subdivision
Alchesay Flats (Goklish Drive)
N.E. Diamond Creek
Diamond Creek Frontage
Hondah Indian Village

Lower Over-the-Rainbow
Cibecue (Lupe Drive)
Cibecue (Henry Drive)
Cedar Creek (Assembly of God)
Rainbow City (Guy Massey, Jr.)
New Fairgrounds Crossing Route 44
Cibecue Indian Springs Re-alignment; and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby adopts the foregoing list of road construction priority as set forth in this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on February 21, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
