RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Council Member Kino Torino advises the Tribal Council that Stago Curve constitutes a very serious road hazard for motor vehicles having been the site of various accidents over the years; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department advises the Tribal Council that in order to properly modify the curve an additional right-of-way easement must be granted to the Bureau in order to complete the necessary safety construction; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that granting an additional right-of-way easement to the Bureau of Indian Affairs in order to eliminate said safety hazard would be in the best interest of the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants a right-of-way easement to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the purposes of modifying Stago Curve to alleviate the existing safety hazard.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department commence construction immediately to modify Stago Curve.

The foregoing resolution was on February 21, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
