RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, representatives from the Tribal Livestock Association have come before the Tribal Council this date with evidence that livestock is being killed through the negligence of persons trapping feral horses on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Livestock Associations have requested that the Tribal Council rescind all horsetrapping permits on the reservation and prohibit any further trapping; and
- WHEREAS, after considerable discussion and review of photographs showing livestock animals caught in horsetraps, the Tribal Council concludes that the request of the Livestock Association should be granted.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby rescinds all trapping permits for feral horses on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that until further notification by the Tribal Council by ordinance or resolution, all trapping of feral horses on the Fort Apache Indian. Reservation is henceforth prohibited.

The foregoing resolution was on March 14, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
