RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee (IACC) has been in existence since 1984 and has been sanctioned by the White Mountain Apache Tribe since 1986 by Resolution No. 03-87-86; and
- WHEREAS, IACC has identified the need for cooperation and coordination among Tribal, IHS, BIA and other governmental agencies providing education, health and human service delivery; and
- WHEREAS, to achieve greater efficiency and effectiveness, the reservation agencies need to update and clarify their primary roles and responsibilities for the full delivery of education, health and human services; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the necessity for coordination and cooperation of all service agencies on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that the assurance of coordination of provider services be implemented through the Inter-Agency Coordination Committee and reaffirms its support of said committee.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it does hereby extend to the Inter-Agency Coordination Committee (IACC) formal Tribal Council recognition and directs the committee to implement the coordination of all programs that serve the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. The committee shall be chaired through the Tribal Office of Education, Health and Human Services and shall report back to the Tribal Council on a continuing basis.

The foregoing resolution was on March 26, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
