RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian reservation, with an area of approximately 2,600 square miles contains more than a thousand miles of various types of improved roads including, but not limited to, state highways, Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) system roads, forestry roads, tribal roads, and logging roads; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that an adequately constructed and maintained road system is necessary for continued economic and community development on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that the development and maintenance of the reservation road system requires sufficient planning in coordination with the Tribal Roads Committee in order to project and prioritize current and future road improvement and construction needs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the BIA contract with the White Mountain Apache Tribe under the provisions of PL 93-638 to conduct a transportation planning study of the Fort Apache Indian reservation as authorized by Section 1B of the Memorandum of Agreement between the BIA and the Federal Highway Administration dated May 23, 1983; the proposed cost of which is approximately \$250,000, available though the BIA Road Division.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is hereby authorized to sign and execute all documents necessary to carry out the directives and purposes of this resolution.
