RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- the Tribal Council has been aware of a drinking water WHEREAS. problem at the Fort Apache Timber Company housing area; and
- Indian Health Service, which is responsible for sewer WHEREAS, and water systems throughout the reservation, has advised that the FATCO drinking water system is not their responsibility because IHS did not install the system; and
- the problem is such that the Tribal Council believes WHEREAS, that Indian Health Service should investigate and implement a remedy for the drinking water problem by construction of an IHS water system to FATCO housing in order to protect the health and safety of persons consuming water from the system; and
- it has been suggested that a new pipe deliver water WHEREAS, from Whiteriver to FATCO be constructed by IHS.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Indian Health Service investigate, plan and construct a water line from Whiteriver to FATCO housing for the purpose of delivering safe drinking water.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests that the Indian Health Service coordinate with Tribal Engineer John Bereman, regarding the construction of said water line.

The foregoing resolution was on September 04, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a, b, h, i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
