## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, funds have been identified and made available from the Bureau of Indian Affairs for curriculum development and training for Child Protective Services on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, Arizona State University has been identified and is interested in providing the training and curriculum development through the office of American Indian Projects; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Social Services has been identified as the agency to receive these funds through a 638 contract modification and is willing to coordinate and monitor these activities.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves Tribal Social Service entering into a contract with Arizona State University for curriculum development and training on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 17, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of  $\underline{six}$  for and  $\underline{zero}$  against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
