## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Members of the Riverside Full Gospel Church have come to the Tribal Council with request for authorization to construct a church on private land owned by the Martin Chinche family in what is known as the "Dirty Dozen Area"; and
- WHEREAS, said church will be on private land and the congregation wishes to convert a brush arbor into a church and explains to the Council that they have already erected a roof for the church but want to close in the sides; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that approval should be granted for this request.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants permission to the Riverside Full Gospel Church to construct a church on the private land of the Martin Chinche Family in what is known as the "Dirty Dozen Area".

The foregoing resolution was on October 02, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
