## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Vice Chairman Lafe Altaha, advises the Tribal Council that tribal members Audie and Nancy Skidmore, had been placed on the HIP Priority List earlier this year by Tribal Council resolution because their house at Rainbow City had burned down; and
- WHEREAS, the Vice Chairman further advises the Council that the Skidmores' still remain homeless and that he requests, therefore, that the Council direct that a resolution be passed to ensure that the Skidmores are selected in the next HIP selection review; and
- WHEREAS, due to the dire circumstances of the Skidmores, the Council agrees with the request made by Vice Chairman Lafe Altaha.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that Audie and Nancy Skidmore be placed on the HIP selection review list for selection for the next available HIP housing.

The foregoing resolution was on November 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
