RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the Governing Body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to obtain funds for direct services to crime victims on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been notified of the grant award in the amount of \$22,500.00 of the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), for the 1991 program year, beginning on October 1, 1991 through June 30, 1992; and
- WHEREAS, the grant award is for the purpose of providing counseling services to children who are victims of crime.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby, approves and accepts the Arizona Department of Public Safety Grant, DPS Contract No. 91-926.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the grant will be implemented and monitored by the Apache Tribal Guidance Center under the Tribal Health Authority.

The foregoing resolution was on November 7, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
