## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is a severe shortage of qualified Native American Teachers; and
- WHEREAS, attrition of Indian students could be reduced if there were more qualified Native American teachers; and
- WHEREAS, Haskell Indian Junior College has designed a teacher education program that will educate persons both academically and culturally; and
- WHEREAS, said program is designed to be implemented beginning in 1993.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of Whiteriver, Arizona, hereby supports the implementation of a teacher education program at haskell Indian Junior College.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby supports the recommendation from the Haskell Board of Regents that the necessary resources be identified and given to Haskell to assure the success of this program.

The foregoing resolution was on November 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
